

Job Announcement

The Department of Geography at Kyungpook National University (KNU) in South Korea invites applications for a tenure track professor in **Climatology**, beginning **September 1, 2019**. This position is initially for two years with a possible extension. Interested candidates may apply online from 29 April 2019 at the KNU website at <http://prad.knu.ac.kr>. The closing date of online registration is 9 May 2019. A review of applications will begin immediately after May 9, 2019. Only those applicants selected for further consideration will be contacted. Applicants must possess a PhD and have demonstrated an excellence in teaching, research and communication. The successful candidate will teach courses defined broadly in the field of Climatology and Physical geography in her/his areas of expertise. The teaching language for this position is Korean; however candidates must be fluent in English since an English lecture is mandatory for more than one course per semester after appointment.

Entrance salary ranges (remuneration net of tax) are dependent on the relevant experience and qualifications. Kyungpook National University and the Department of Geography can help an appointee find suitable accommodation on campus. We will provide you with an office, which includes a telephone and a personal computer for word processing, internet use and e-mail. In addition, all standard privileges granted to tenure track professors will be available. These include access to the library system, photocopying and computer labs etc. KNU is committed to providing "family friendly" policies and programs that maintain a supportive environment for the diverse needs of its employees.

KNU is located in Daegu, a city with a population of 2.5 million; recognized as the third most important city in South Korea.
