

Washington State University, Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering invites applications for a non-tenure-track faculty position in **water resources and environmental engineering** effective January 1, 2015. The successful candidate for the position will be expected to teach undergraduate and graduate courses that may include introduction to environmental engineering, fluid mechanics, water resource engineering, advanced hydrology, aquatic chemistry, and other courses as needed. Preference will be given to candidates with MS or PhD degree in Civil Engineering and who have a demonstrated and successful teaching record in undergraduate civil engineering courses with applicable professional experience. The Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering consists of 35 full-time faculty, and offers programs leading to BSCE, MSCE, MSEE, and Ph.D. degrees. Applications will be accepted until the position is filled. However, review of applications will begin August 15, 2014. This is a fixed-term 9-month academic appointment funded from the date of hire. The appointment may be considered for renewal subject to availability of funds and mutual agreement and compliance with university hiring procedures.
